Bahrain

National Bureau for Revenue (NBR) issues guidance on Domestic Minimum Top-Up Tax (DMTT) advance payment process

On 2 July 2025, the NBR issued the DMTT Advance Payment Manual which provides an overview of the DMTT advance payment process along with functionalities and related forms which are now available on the NBR's portal. The NBR has also published the updated version of the DMTT Administrative Guide which contains additional details regarding advance payment computation, along with examples.

Zakat, Tax and Customs Authority (ZATCA) conducts tax and zakat related workshops

United Arab Emirates (UAE)

Federal Tax Authority (FTA) issues new Corporate Tax (CT) Public Clarification

The FTA has recently released <u>Public Clarification CTP006</u> on the waiver of administrative penalty for failure to submit a CT registration application within the specified deadline.

FTA conducts tax related workshops

Tax treaty updates

- On 7 July 2025, the President of Russia signed Law No. 189-FZ, ratifying the 'Russia UAE Income and Capital Tax Treaty (2025)'.
- On 10 July 2025, the Senate of Chad adopted a bill ratifying the 'Chad UAE Income Tax Treaty (2018)'.

Kuwait

Ministry of Finance issues Executive Regulations for the DMTT Law

Following the issuance of Ministerial Decree No. 157 of 2024 (which formally introduced DMTT in Kuwait), the Kuwaiti Ministry of Finance has issued the Executive Regulations for DMTT, providing detailed provisions for the implementation and compliance requirements for the new tax framework.

Tax treaty update

On 29 June 2025, the Kuwaiti Council of Ministers issued Decree-Law No. 80 of 2025 approving the income tax treaty with KSA, originally signed on 4 December 2024.

Oman

Tax treaty update

On 4 July 2025, Luxembourg ratified the Luxembourg - Oman Income and Capital Tax Treaty (2024).

Qatar

General Tax Authority (GTA) conducts tax related workshops

On July 7 2025, the GTA in collaboration with the Ministry of Social Development and Family organized an awareness workshop for owners of "Home Grown" projects entitled "Your Step Towards Tax Compliance for Home Grown Projects".

GTA refers 13 companies to public prosecution

The GTA has announced that it has referred 13 companies to the public prosecution after these companies were implicated in cases of tax evasion amounting to roughly QAR 36 million.
