## **Governance**

The organisation's governance around climate-related risks and opportunities.

## **Strategy**

The actual and potential impacts of climate-related risks and opportunities on the organisation's businesses, strategy, and financial planning.

## **Risk Management**

The processes used by the organisation to identify, assess, and manage climate-related risks.

## **Metrics and Targets**

The metrics and targets used to assess and manage relevant climate-related risks and opportunities.
