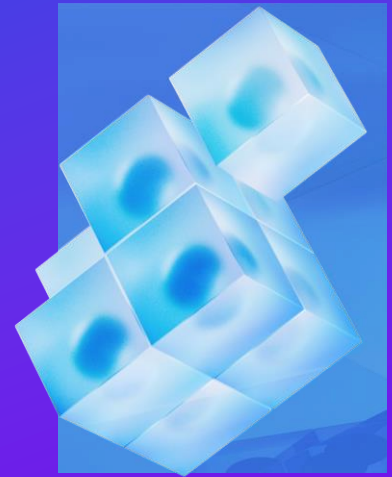


Enhancing Governance of Integrated Care Systems



Effective Integrated Care Systems (ICSs) require a balance of autonomy and robust, effective accountability to sustain and demonstrate both performance improvement, as well as effective financial controls. Integrated Care Boards (ICBs) need to ensure they have fit for purpose governance and operating models that effectively support the different organisations across the system to deliver on the four key aims of the Health and Care Act 2022.

How should systems respond?

As highlighted by the Hewitt Review, ICBs should:

- 1 Review their governance arrangements as an opportunity to engage with all system partners to consider how the ICB is operating within the overall ICS architecture, and gain clarity over accountabilities
- 2 Go through self-assessment or mutual peer-review to support self-development.
- 3 Reflect and consider whether it needs to do more to ensure that social care providers are involved in planning and decision making, and that public health expertise is being effectively deployed within the system

What outcomes should you expect?

- Agreed focused set of priorities
- Understanding of current state and gaps in governance
- High-level future state governance structure
- Associated True Norths (system vision and relevant oversight metrics)
- Roadmap for governance implementation, including prioritised list of areas for the ICS to develop to ensure effective decision making and collaboration across the system.
