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Healthcare regulatory news

CMS released the 2019 Medicare Advantage and Part D Advance Notice and Draft Call Letter (Part II) which proposes an average 1.84% rate increase and would allow MA plans to offer new supplemental benefits... CMS will begin paying certain claims for outpatient therapy held since January 1 as a result of Congressional failure to pass Medicare extenders.

CMS <u>extended a temporary moratorium</u> in six states on new home health agencies and Medicare Part B nonemergency ground ambulance providers and suppliers... CMS <u>approved a one-month</u>

<u>extension</u> of Indiana's current 1115 Medicaid waiver as <u>agency</u> <u>review of a longer extension</u> continues.

A <u>Justice Department memo</u> prohibits the department litigators <u>from using guidance documents</u> to establish a violation of an applicable statute or regulation in affirmative civil enforcement actions.



Healthcare law and policy news

Amazon, JPMorgan Chase, and Berkshire Hathaway <u>announced</u> <u>plans</u> to join forces to address rising healthcare costs for their employees, initially focusing on "technology solutions"... the <u>Justice Department requested</u> additional details on the proposed CVS-Aetna merger.

Congressional Republicans <u>are not likely</u> to attempt another repeal of the ACA repeal this year... <u>President Trump said HHS Secretary Alex Azar would</u> be "very tough" on pharmaceutical companies and bring "drug prices way down"; in his <u>State of the Union</u> speech, Trump said drug prices would be one of his "greatest priorities".

CDC Director <u>Brenda Fitzgerald resigned</u> following questions about a tobacco company stock purchases and other financial conflicts of interest... <u>House Oversight Committee Chairman</u> Trey Gowdy (R-SC) criticized HHS for failing to fulfill Committee request in a timely fashion and withholding documents necessary for proper oversight... Senate Finance Committee Chair Orrin Hatch (R-UT) <u>urged HHS Secretary Azar</u> to move oversight of the 340B drug discount program from HRSA to CMS.

More states are reconsidering expanding Medicaid, in part due to CMS guidance creating a pathway for imposing eligibility work requirement... The Medicaid and CHIP Payment and Access Commission (MACPAC) recommended allowing states to enroll all Medicaid beneficiaries into managed care programs without requiring a waiver from CMS.

<u>Kaiser Family Foundation estimated</u> that Medicare beneficiaries spent 41% of their Social Security income on out-of-pocket

healthcare costs in 2013, that percentage is expected to increase to 50% by 2030.



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
