The KPMG Center for Healthcare Regulatory Insight <u>released a</u> <u>paper on Monday</u> examining the evolution of Medicare alternative payment models (APMs) since passage of MACRA; barriers to more rapid model development; and ways to improve the Physicianfocused Payment Model Technical Advisory Committee (PTAC) review process, including to align with CMS' vision for launching new APMs. An accompanying <u>Health Affairs</u> article raises questions about the current PTAC role in APM development.

Healthcare regulatory news

The <u>FDA requested feedback</u> on regulating premium cigars; Commissioner Scott Gottlieb indicated the agency <u>may try to</u> <u>regulate electronic cigarettes</u> as over-the-counter drugs... Gottlieb also <u>announced efforts</u> to encourage healthy eating through consumer education and better food labeling... FDA <u>draft</u> <u>guidance</u> details how it will evaluate and list bulk drug substances used in compounding by outsourcing facilities.

The National Diabetes Prevention Program will be <u>available to all</u> <u>eligible Medicare beneficiaries</u> beginning April 1... HHS <u>may</u> <u>delay</u>, for the fifth time, the effective date of a rule regulating 340B Medicaid drug discount program <u>ceiling prices and</u> <u>manufacturer civil monetary penalties</u>.

CMS CCIIO Director Randy Pate <u>told state insurance</u> <u>commissioners</u> that CMS is working to revise guidance on ACA 1332 state innovation waivers, and <u>encouraged states to use</u> *(subscription required)* the enhanced direct enrollment process <u>detailed by CMS in February</u>... Congressional Democrats <u>requested that GAO study</u> the administrative costs associated with state 1115 Medicaid waivers that include work requirements.

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Healthcare law and policy news

CDC <u>reported</u> that the opioid epidemic "continues to worsen" based on analysis of 2016 drug overdose data... President Trump <u>announced</u> that he will nominate current White House physician, Admiral Ronny Jackson, to <u>replace David Shulkin</u> as VA Secretary.

Wal-Mart is in <u>early talks</u> to acquire Humana... Healthcare mergers and acquisition values have <u>reached more than \$156</u> <u>billion</u> this year, the most for a first quarter in over a decade; meanwhile, a <u>UC Berkeley study</u> found that highly concentrated markets are associated with higher prices for hospital and physician services, and ACA premiums... The <u>American Antitrust</u> <u>Institute told the Justice Department</u> that the proposed CVS-Aetna merger will "potentially harm competition and consumers" and "trigger a fundamental restructuring" of the healthcare system. Takeda Pharmaceutical is <u>considering making a bid</u> to acquire Shire... Aetna <u>announced it would</u> pass on negotiated prescription drug discounts to about 3 million of its members... A Senate Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee <u>minority report</u> concluded that the prices for the 20 most commonly prescribed prescription drugs increased 12% every year for the past five years, or ten times faster than inflation... A JAMA study found that nearly 40% of Americans were obese in 2015 and 2016, up 34% from a decade ago.
