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Attorney General Jeff Sessions proposed new regulations limiting production of addictive opioids through DEA-established quotas to hold manufacturers accountable for excessive drug distribution... OMB is reviewing the annual hospital <u>inpatient</u>, hospital <u>outpatient</u>, <u>SNF</u>, and <u>physician</u> payment updates; the physician payment update <u>may include rules</u> for the Quality Payment Program 2019 performance year... HHS <u>proposed</u> <u>delaying</u> implementation of the "Common Rule" on human subjects research to January 2019. CMS <u>released a set of interactive maps</u> and data showing market saturation of different providers... <u>CMS is appealing</u> a <u>February</u> <u>court decision</u> blocking its DSH payment changes from being enforced in Missouri; CMS has until May 7 to appeal a federal court decision halting national enforcement of its 2017 DSH rule.

<u>FDA announced a comprehensive plan</u> to enhance medical device safety... FDA issued <u>final guidance</u> on special protocol assessment (SPA) agreements to facilitate drug manufacturers and FDA <u>alignment</u> on the design and size of certain clinical trials to appropriately address scientific and regulatory requirements... An FDA <u>advisory panel recommended approval</u> of the first cannabidiol drug.

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Healthcare law and policy news

President Trump <u>will announce plans</u> for addressing prescription drug prices on April 26, including ideas from his budget released earlier this year; OMB is <u>meanwhile reviewing an associated</u> <u>regulation</u>, "HHS Strategy to Lower Drug Prices and Reduce Outof-Pocket Costs."

<u>OIG reported</u> that Medicare spending on telehealth increased from \$61,302 in 2011 to \$17.6 million in 2015; however 31% of the services in their audit did not comply with Medicare requirements... OIG also reported <u>CMS failed to prevent</u> improper drug benefit payments for dead beneficiaries, totaling \$1.1 million for more than 65,000 excess monthly payments.

Wisconsin Governor Scott Walker <u>formally requested a 1332</u> <u>waiver</u> to establish a \$200M ACA reinsurance program... A federal appeals court <u>struck down</u> a Maryland <u>"price gouging" law</u> that allowed the state to sue generic drug manufacturers sharply increasing drug prices... Highmark Health announced <u>an</u> <u>outcomes-based contract</u> for AstraZeneca's Symbicort... Amazon <u>abandoned plans</u> to sell pharmaceuticals and medical equipment to large healthcare practices and hospitals... A <u>study in the New</u> <u>England Journal of Medicine</u> concluded that just 37% of the 2017 QPP measures are "valid" for assessing physician performance.
