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FDA <u>draft REMS guidance provides</u> general principles and recommendations to assist drug manufacturers in <u>developing</u> <u>Single System REMS programs</u> and situations in which <u>FDA will</u> <u>consider waiving</u> the single, shared system requirement... FDA is <u>gathering input</u> on the benefits and risks of <u>non-device medical</u> <u>software</u> products.

OMB is <u>reviewing a final rule</u> delaying penalties for drug manufacturers that overcharge hospitals for prescription drugs under the 340B Program... CMS is <u>seeking comments</u> on relaunching a demonstration for "developing improved procedures for the identification, investigation, and prosecution" of home health agencies Medicare fraud.



Healthcare law and policy news

President Trump <u>appointed Peter O'Rourke</u> Acting VA Secretary, pending Robert Wilkie's confirmation... President Trump signed the <u>"right to try" bill</u> and suggested that drug manufacturers will "<u>announce voluntary massive drops in prices</u>" in two weeks.

U.S. <u>spending on cancer drugs</u> doubled in the last five years to \$50 billion annually, and will likely double again over the next five years, with 12-15% annual growth... <u>Health Care Cost Institute</u> <u>reported</u> that average ER spending for commercially-insured individuals increased 98% between 2009 and 2016 (\$125 to \$247); overall ER use remained the same, with prices nearly doubling for the highest severity visits..... Senator Bill Cassidy <u>released a white paper</u> with ideas to make healthcare more affordable.

<u>American Cancer Society recommended</u> screening for colorectal cancer begin at age 45, rather than 50... the <u>AMA reported</u> that the number of opioids prescribed last year dropped 9%, the fifth consecutive annual decline... CMS <u>announced that 91% of MIPS-</u> <u>eligible clinicians</u> participated in the first year of the QPP.

Virginia <u>passed legislation that will</u> expand Medicaid in the state, while advocates in Utah <u>collected enough signatures</u> to put expansion on the state's ballot this fall... New Jersey <u>enacted an</u> <u>individual health insurance mandate</u> to take effect January 1, 2019... Connecticut <u>enacted a bill</u> requiring drug manufacturers to justify price increases of 20% or more per year.

WellCare <u>will acquire Meridian's</u> PBM and health plans for \$2.5 billion... Nineteen Attorneys General <u>urged HHS to implement</u> reforms begun in 2016 to protect skilled nursing facility patients... the Community Oncology Alliance <u>sued HHS and OMB</u> to stop the 2% sequester of Medicare Part B drug reimbursement.

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
