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The 2019 Medicare Shared Savings Program (MSSP) proposed rule would overhaul the ACO program with <u>a basic track</u> requiring twosided risk assumption after 2 years (1 year for current participants), and an enhanced track that begins in two-sided risk... CMS <u>proposed rule</u> would adopt the ACA risk adjustment program it previously established for the 2018 benefit year... OMB is reviewing a <u>proposed rule</u> impacting Medicaid and CHIP managed care provider enrollment and terminations. CMS <u>guidance encourages</u> "unloaded silver plans" outside the Exchange in some states... a Medicaid Rebate Program <u>notice</u> provides calculation guidance impacting drug manufacturer rebate liability for line extensions... FDA <u>draft guidance</u> establishes new endpoints for demonstrating effectiveness of medication-assisted treatment for opioid use disorder... FDA approved the first <u>generic</u> <u>drug under the Competitive Generic Therapy</u> designation; FDA <u>approved or tentatively approved</u> a record number of generics in July (126).

President Trump <u>told business leaders</u> an announcement is coming next week to get drug prices down "really, really substantially"... CMS <u>will allow Medicare Advantage plans</u> to use step therapy for Part B drugs in 2019... the <u>FDA and FTC are partnering</u> to address rising drug prices.

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Healthcare law and policy news

AMA <u>urged the Justice Department</u> to block the proposed CVS-Aetna merger; Rite Aid and Albertson <u>terminated</u> their proposed \$24B merger... <u>Express Scripts will stop covering</u> 48 brand-name drugs next year, saving more than \$3B... Humana <u>sued dozens of</u> <u>generic drug manufacturers</u> for alleged price-fixing that increased drug prices as much as 8,000%.

<u>Memorial Sloan Kettering researchers</u> concluded that the US spent \$480 billion (nearly 15% of total healthcare spending) on prescription drugs in 2016, when gross profits of intermediaries such as PBMs are included... <u>CVS argued</u> that there is little relationship between the size of a drug rebate and list price increases, deflecting assertions that <u>PBMs are responsible</u> for increasing costs.

Altarum <u>reported that health spending grew</u> 5.2% over the past year, up from 4.2% the previous year... National Business Group on Health <u>projected that employers will spend</u> \$14,800 per employee on health coverage next year, up 5% from this year... Henry Ford Health System will <u>contract directly with General</u> <u>Motors</u> to offer new health plan options for 3,000 employees in 2019.
