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Healthcare regulatory news

CMS Administrator <u>Seema Verma announced</u> coming Medicaid program changes and defended Medicaid work requirements.... A <u>Department of Homeland Security proposed rule</u> would require immigrants seeking a change in status to demonstrate they have not received certain public benefits, including Medicaid. OIG <u>released a toolkit</u> to help State Medicaid Fraud Control Units (MFCUs) design statistical samples for calculating improper payment amounts and <u>reported that Medicare Advantage plans</u> may be improperly denying patient care. <u>CMS projected</u> that MA enrollment will reach 22.6 million (36.7% of Medicare beneficiaries) in 2019 and that average premiums will decrease \$1.81 to \$28.

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Healthcare law and policy news

The House is expected to pass the <u>opioid epidemic package</u> today... after Senate passage next week, President Trump is expected to sign the bill, along with an <u>\$854 billion spending bill</u> that includes FY2019 funding for HHS and <u>legislation to prevent</u> pharmacist "gag clauses."

Kaiser Family Foundation estimated that premiums will increase an average of less than 5% nationally... HHS Secretary <u>Alex Azar</u> <u>credited Trump administration efforts</u> for benchmark plan premium decreases of 2% nationally... Average <u>ACA premium in</u> <u>Maryland</u> will decrease 13.2% next year... OPM reported that <u>premiums for federal employees and retirees</u> will increase an average of 1.5% in 2019.

<u>AARP reported</u> that brand drug prices increased an average of 8.4% in 2017; meanwhile <u>AP found</u> that there have been 16.5 drug price increases for every price cut since June following President Trump's predicted cuts... Gilead <u>announced plans</u> to manufacture an authorized generic of their hepatitis C drugs, Harvoni and Epclusa.

Health Management Associates <u>will pay more than \$260 million</u> to settle criminal healthcare fraud charges... UnitedHealth Group <u>informed 350 Envision hospitals</u> that they may be dropped from its network... United <u>purchased Genoa Healthcare</u> for \$2.5 billion... Aetna will <u>sell its Medicare Part D business</u> to WellCare to clear a path to approval of the CVS-Aetna merger.

CDC estimated that the <u>flu killed 80,000 Americans</u> last winter... JAMA studies found that <u>heath data breaches increased</u> from 199 in 2010 to 344 in 2017 and that the <u>median cost for major drug</u> <u>trials</u> is \$19 million, less than 1% of the average total cost to develop new drugs.
