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Healthcare regulatory news

CMS <u>reported that Medicaid spending</u> reached nearly \$600 billion in 2017, and could exceed \$1 trillion over the next decade.

OMB <u>began review</u> of an ONC rule to <u>implement parts of the 21<sup>st</sup></u> <u>Century Cures Act</u>, including defining information blocking... A <u>CMS proposed rule</u> aims to reduce or remove <u>Medicare provider</u> <u>and supplier regulations</u> that are "unnecessary, obsolete, or excessively burdensome". FDA is considering a <u>"subscription-based model"</u> to supply hospitals with antibiotics... FDA <u>launched an education campaign</u> to reduce e-cigarette use among teenagers.

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## Healthcare law and policy news

HHS <u>awarded \$1 billion in grants</u> to states, communities, and organizations to address the opioid crisis and is <u>working with</u> <u>Opiant Pharmaceuticals</u> to develop a fast-acting, intranasal, overdose drug... SAMHSA <u>reported that 11.4 million Americans</u> abused opioids in 2017, down from 11.8 million in 2016 and 12.7 million in 2015... <u>AHRQ reported</u> that seniors hospitalized with opioid-related diagnoses increased more than 50% and opioidrelated ED visits increased more than 100% between 2010 and 2015.

The <u>Senate passed an \$8.4 billion opioid package</u>; Congressional leaders hope to reconcile it with the House version for a final vote next week; PhRMA is <u>promoting inclusion of a provision</u> to reduce manufacturer payments for the Part D donut hole... The Senate <u>passed legislation</u> (98-2) to prohibit pharmacist "gag clauses"... a <u>bipartisan Senate bill</u> would crack down on surprise billing from out-of-network providers.

HHS reached <u>HIPAA settlements</u> with three hospitals that allowed TV crews to film patients without consent... DOJ approved the \$67 billion <u>Cigna-Express Scripts merger</u>.

Athenahealth <u>extended the deadline</u> for potential acquirer bids... AHA <u>launched an initiative</u> to promote transparency of hospital savings from the 340B drug discount program... <u>46brooklyn</u> <u>reports</u> that some generic drug prices, including for those most frequently prescribed, are declining...The <u>National Quality Forum</u> <u>released</u> its first quality measures for rural hospitals and ambulatory care facilities.

A <u>Health Affairs study</u> found that per-person healthcare spending increased 44% between 2007 and 2016, or 4% annually... <u>CDC</u> <u>estimates</u> that the percentage of the US population with Alzheimer's and related dementia will double by 2060 to 13.9 million, or 5% of the population...<u>Moody's warned</u> that rising

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
