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Healthcare regulatory news

HHS published its <u>semiannual regulatory agenda</u>... A <u>CMS</u> <u>proposed rule</u> would require manufacturers to <u>disclose wholesale</u> <u>acquisition costs</u> for Medicare and Medicaid drugs in direct-to-consumer television advertisements; meanwhile <u>PhRMA</u> <u>announced that dozens of manufacturers</u> will direct patients to their websites for drug cost information.

FTC <u>took legal action</u> against two stem cell clinics for <u>deceptive</u> advertising of potential treatment benefits.

FDA guidance provides more clarity and direction to drug developers for pursuing next generation therapies and treatments, and early stage development of rare disease treatments... FDA recommended development of global standards for generic drugs... FDA and DHS agreed to collaborate on medical device cybersecurity... FDA's Oncologic Drugs Advisory Committee unanimously recommended approval of Celltrion and Teva's biosimilar to Genentech's Rituxan.



Healthcare law and policy news

CMS <u>announced</u> that average Part B premiums will increase \$1.50 next year to \$134, along with a \$2 increase in the deductible to \$185; the Part A deductible will increase \$20 to \$1,364... KFF reported that the average Medicare beneficiary will have <u>24 MA plans</u> and <u>27 Part D standalone plans</u> to choose from during open enrollment.

Mary Mayhew, former commissioner of the Maine Department of Health and Human Services, <u>was appointed</u> Deputy Administrator of CMS and Director of Medicaid and CHIP.

Virginia will <u>begin accepting applications</u> on November 1 from 400,000 newly eligible Medicaid expansion beneficiaries... Arkansas <u>will remove 4,109 more residents</u> from Medicaid for failing to meet work requirements... <u>GAO reported</u> that more low-income individuals in Medicaid non-expansion states (19.9%) had unmet medical needs in the past year than low-income individuals in expansion states (9.4%).

Anthem <u>will pay \$16 million</u> to settle HIPAA data breaches in 2015 affecting nearly 79 million people... A <u>federal court</u> ordered HHS to pay Sanford Health Plan \$360,000 in cost-sharing reduction (CSR) payments owed for Q4 of 2017... Novartis <u>will acquire Endocyte</u> for \$2.1 billion.... UnitedHealthcare will <u>mandate "step therapy"</u> for at least three categories of drugs in some of its MA plans.

A <u>Commonwealth Fund-NYTimes-Harvard survey</u> found that 36% of seriously ill patients had used up all or most of their savings on care... A <u>BMJ</u> study found that accredited hospitals don't have significantly better mortality and readmission rates than non-accredited facilities.
