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Healthcare regulatory news

CMS released several fee schedule final rules: The physician fee schedule rule implements new evaluation and management billing for 2021; expands payment for "virtual" care; and reduces the ASP add-on for Part B drugs in the first quarter of sales from 6% to 3%. The rule also finalizes 2019 QPP policies, including allowing low-volume clinicians to opt into MIPS participation. The hospital outpatient rule phases in site-neutral payments for clinic visits and updates and streamlines quality measures for outpatient departments and ASCs. The DME and ESRD rule revises the competitive bidding program and encourages innovative therapies for ESRD. The CMS home health rule expands access to remote

patient monitoring technology, updates payments with a new case-mix system, and begins a new home infusion therapy benefit.

A CMS MA and Part D policy proposed rule for 2020 would provide more flexibility for plans to cover telehealth, streamline benefits, and update the risk adjustment data validation (RADV) audit process... OMB began review of a proposed "drug pricing" rule for Part D and MA... A HRSA proposed rule would move up enforcement of 340B ceiling prices and manufacturer civil monetary penalties to January 1... A federal judge ordered HHS to eliminate its Medicare hospital appeals backlog by 2022.

FDA <u>approved Novartis' biosimilar</u> of Abbvie's Humira and <u>authorized</u> the first direct-to-consumer DNA test to help determine individual effectiveness of certain medications, while also <u>warning about potential false claims</u> about their utility... OIG <u>reported that FDA</u> post-market medical device cybersecurity plans and procedures do not go far enough to protect public health.





Healthcare law and policy news

A <u>Clearwater survey</u> found that only 29% of health systems have implemented a comprehensive cybersecurity program.

ACA open enrollment began on Thursday with less CMS funding for "navigators"... CMS approved Wisconsin's 1115 Medicaid waiver to impose work requirements and add new copays and premiums... MACPAC urged HHS to pause Medicaid work requirements; warned that the immigration public charge proposed rule could depress Medicaid enrollment; and explored methods to rebase DSH allotments.

A <u>Politico/Morning Consult poll</u> found 65% of respondents support Medicaid expansion in their state...

Avalere estimated that <u>2.7 million Americans could gain access to Medicaid</u> as a result of the midterm elections.



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
