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Healthcare regulatory news

An <u>FDA proposed rule</u> would streamline and clarify the process for evaluating low and moderate-risk medical devices... <u>FDA approved</u> Editas Medicine to test a CRISPR-based therapy on patients with a genetic blindness disorder... An FDA and World Health Organization <u>pilot program</u> aims to expedite HIV drug application reviews.

GAO <u>found that 69% of approved orphan drug applications</u> in late 2017 were deficient... <u>GAO reported</u> that CMS could pay billions

more than necessary for clinical lab tests through 2020 if it does not gather more complete private payer payment rate data; meanwhile <u>ACLA filed an appeal</u> challenging the payment policy.

CMS released the <u>2018 ACA risk adjustment methodology</u> final rule... CMS <u>announced that more than 55% of hospitals</u> will receive incentive payments in 2019 under the Value-based Purchasing Program, down from 57% in FY2018... CMS <u>announced oversight</u> of nursing home safety, including assuring adequate facility staffing... CMS <u>reported that 48.74%</u> of Medicare Advantage provider directories have at least one inaccuracy.

<u>OIG found</u> that more than 20% of Medicare patients receiving treatment in long-term care facilities have experienced serious harm... OMB is <u>reviewing a final rule</u> to improve the Medicare provider enrollment process.

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Healthcare law and policy news

HHS released a <u>report on improving "choice and competition"</u> in healthcare markets... HHS Secretary Alex Azar <u>named John</u> <u>O'Brien</u> his new senior adviser on drug pricing.

<u>CMS reported</u> that national health spending grew 3.9% in 2017, 1% slower than 2016... Just under <u>3.2 million individuals</u> have enrolled in healthcare.gov plans, down from <u>3.6 million</u> last year.

AHA and AAMC <u>sued HHS</u> to stop the <u>site-neutral payment</u> <u>policy</u>... A US District Court Judge <u>ordered CVS and Aetna</u> to provide justification for their merger by December 14<sup>th</sup> for a hearing on December 18<sup>th</sup>... 13 Attorneys General <u>sued two heath</u> <u>IT companies</u> for data breaches resulting in theft of medical information from 4 million patients.

Pfizer <u>agreed to delay</u> launch of its biosimilar for Abbvie's Humira by five years... GlaxoSmithKline <u>will acquire Tesaro</u> for \$5.1 billion... Takeda <u>shareholders approved</u> its acquisition of Shire... Actelion Pharmaceuticals <u>will pay \$360 million</u> to settle a charity co-pay investigation. <u>HIMSS Analytics found</u> that fewer than 15% of 159 healthcare organizations consider themselves "well prepared" for blockchain.

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
