Australia

Small business loan guarantee scheme extended; new tourism package announced

A number of economic support measures have been announced for businesses, as the economy transitions from the government's wage subsidy offered in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Tax treatment of working-from-home benefits; deductibility of JobKeeper repayments

The Australian Taxation Office (ATO) issued guidance relating to certain relief provided in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

India

Next phase for mandatory e-invoice issuance, beginning 1 April 2021

The next phase of mandatory e-invoices is effective 1 April 2021 for taxpayers having turnover in excess of INR 50 crore. As of 1 April 2021, these taxpayers must issue e-invoices for all business-to-business (B2B) supplies - including exports.



Malaysia

Digital platforms subject to tourism tax, effective July 2021

Newly enacted legislation imposes the tourism tax on digital platforms that provide tourism-related services.

New Zealand

Moving in a positive direction

The deadline for the first year R&D claims is fast approaching, being 30 April 2021. Claims have been rolling in and the experience so far has highlighted that there are teething issues in the administration of the scheme.
