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## Ireland - Re-Entry Visa Requirements Suspension for Minors under 16 Continues

In June 2022, Ireland's Immigration Service Delivery (ISD) suspended re-entry visa requirements for minors under 16 years of age with immediate effect and until further notice.<sup>1</sup> ISD has now confirmed that this suspension will remain in place, until further notice.<sup>2</sup>

Children under 16 are not issued Irish Residence Permits (IRP) cards (for prior coverage, see <u>GMS Flash Alert 2022-125</u>, 22 June 2022). Prior to June 2022, visa-required children residing with their parents in Ireland had to apply for a re-entry visa to allow them to travel back into the country after any period of departure.

Since the suspension in June of re-entry visas for children under 16, the visa-required children who wish to re-enter Ireland must be accompanied by a parent or guardian who has legal permission to reside in Ireland. The adult accompanying the child must provide appropriate documentation to prove they are the child's legal parent or guardian.

#### WHY THIS MATTERS

The June 2022 announcement was welcomed by visa-required non-European Economic Area (EEA) nationals and their families as it was no longer a requirement for the parents of visa-required minors to submit their original supporting documents to ISD for the issuance of re-entry visas for their children, which is often a cumbersome and lengthy process.

This announcement continues this policy until further notice and will reduce administrative burdens and delays for families planning to travel outside of Ireland.

#### **Notice for Employers**

- Under the instructions provided by ISD, minors under 16 who wish to re-enter the country must be accompanied by a parent or guardian who has a legal permission to reside in Ireland.<sup>3</sup>
- Employees impacted by the announcement must carry appropriate documentation to prove they are the legal parent or guardian of the child.
- Suitable documents to prove the relationship between the parent or guardian and the child are:
  - o a birth or adoption certificate, or guardianship papers showing the relationship with the child;
  - o a marriage/divorce certificate if the individual is the child's parent but has a different surname;
  - o a death certificate in the case of a deceased parent.
