This is a preliminary report based on National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) Ranking 2023 released by Ministry of Education (MoE) on 5 June 2023.

# Foreword- KPMG in India

Institutional rankings have increasingly become the yardstick for quality and performance of educational institutions across the globe. Since its introduction in 2016, the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) has seen a widespread adoption by Indian Higher Education (HE) institutions and acceptance by various stakeholders. Parents and prospective students consider rankings while choosing an institution to pursue higher education. Employers look at institute rankings for recruitment and consultation. For Faculty, increasingly, rank of the institution is a key criterion to decide on their career. For the regulator, rankings have become a key parameter for assessment - to decide on concessions, research grants, recently providing eligibility for offering online programs etc. Other ecosystem players such as banks, service providers, foreign institutions etc., also place significant importance on rankings. Overall, NIRF has become an essential part of Indian Higher Education institutions.

The 8<sup>th</sup> edition of the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) was released on 5 June 2023. Since its introduction in 2016, NIRF has grown rapidly in terms of ranking categories as well as participating institutes. Agriculture & Allied sectors and Innovation category rankings are the latest addition (introduced in 2023) and have seen participation from institutions across the country. In 2023, 'Architecture' category has been renamed as 'Architecture & Planning' and the scope of architecture rankings has also been expanded to include institutions imparting education in urban as well as town-planning. A total of 13 category rankings were released under NIRF 2023.

The ranking methodology and metrics continue to be the same as the previous year. For the newly introduced Agriculture & Allied sector rankings, a fresh ranking framework was developed, and for Innovation category also a new methodology was developed by Atal Ranking Institutions of India (ARIA), Innovation cell of the Ministry of Education. The methodology for the research category is tailor made for the category with significant focus on research parameters and outputs.

A total of 5543 unique institutions have participated in NIRF 2023, almost a 15 per cent rise from NIRF 2022 (4780). This year too, Tamil Nadu, Delhi, Karnataka, Maharashtra emerge as states with the maximum number of top ranked institutions across ranking categories.

This paper captures the key highlights of NIRF 2023 across categories. Across each category, the paper captures the top performers, rank versus score distribution, geographic distribution, new entrants, institutes with maximum improvement and drop in ranks compared to previous year and overall parameter and sub parameter trends across categories.

We, at KPMG in India, thank everyone who has helped us in bringing out this paper. We hope that stakeholders working in the higher education sector find this report useful to understand the NIRF rankings better, thereby enabling them to structure their efforts for ranking improvements more effectively.

# Key highlights of NIRF 2023

## NIRF Ranking 2023 – Key Highlights

The National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) was launched in 2016 for assessing the performance of higher education institutes in India and the eighth edition was released on 5 June 2023.

**Increasing popularity of NIRF:** The 2023 edition saw 8,686 applications for ranking from 5,543 unique institutions, which is an increase of about 20 per cent applications and 15 per cent institutions from previous

year. The Y-o-Y growth in the number of institutions and applications highlight the increasing awareness and acceptance of NIRF ranking among the different stakeholders in higher education. The eighth edition of NIRF ranking also saw addition of two new categories: Agriculture and Allied, and Innovation taking the total number of categories to 12 (excluding overall category) and the scope of Architecture category was expanded to include programmes and faculty pertaining to Planning.

**Higher competitive levels and quality improvement of institutions:** The eighth edition of NIRF rankings has been more competitive than the previous edition with a marked increase in the average scores of all ranked institutions across all the categories. While the parameters/ sub-parameters for ranking and methodology of ranking have, largely, remained the same, this marked increase in the average score indicates an improvement in the quality of higher education institutions in the country.

This upward movement of average scores along with a Y-o-Y increase in overall participation in rankings indicate the need for institutions to

- Adopt national and global best practices to improve institutional outcomes
- Build capabilities and capacities for continuous improvement
- Invest in long-term institutional planning
- Align institutional priorities with changing regulatory conditions
- Create an enabling environment for implementation of outcome focused initiatives

**Primary drivers of performance:** Some categories that have seen a marked improvement in average scores are University (1.70), Engineering (1.66), Medical (2.91), Pharmacy (2.27), and Architecture and Planning (1.88). The general trend observed is that the improvement in average scores across these categories has been primarily driven by increased focus of institutions on research outcomes. Maximum

improvement is seen in RPC scores for all these categories except Medical (TLR has shown maximum improvement)


While the increased focus on research has been a result of various initiatives at the Central, State, and Institutional levels, the higher weightage given to research in NIRF methodology (across most categories) can also be seen as one of the drivers that has pushed institutions towards focusing and investing more on achieving better research outcomes.

In addition, there has been an all-round performance improvement (except in perception across some categories) in 2023 rankings highlighting that the top institutions in the country are undertaking initiatives across all areas to be continuously ranked and to stay relevant.

**Dominance of INIs and universities in ranking:** With respect to the type of institutions dominating NIRF 2023 rankings (considering only unique ranks across categories), share of affiliated colleges has dropped from 22 per cent in 2022 to 13 per cent in 2023 whereas share of state public universities has increased from 14 per cent in 2022 to 19 per cent in 2023. These could be, primarily, attributed to the following:

- Unique ranks in engineering category brought down from 200 to 100 – Dominance of affiliated colleges (31 per cent of all ranked institutions in 2022) in this category reduced to just nearly seven per cent in 2023
- The new category Agriculture and Allied is dominated by State Public universities (>70per cent)
- While affiliated colleges are seen to perform on par/ better than universities in TLR and GO parameters, they fall behind the universities by a significant margin in research (given the teaching focus of colleges). The research focus (in terms of resources and investment) of affiliated colleges is low by design. However, as part of rankings, across categories, they are required to compete with INIs and universities that have higher research capabilities and focus. This is seen to impact the overall ranking of affiliated colleges across the different categories as research is given a higher weightage (across most of the categories).

Share of ranks by institution type





Out of all the ranked institutes,

- Institutions of national importance and State Public Universities with 21 per cent and 19 per cent each, take the largest share in rankings
- Private deemed universities and affiliated colleges come third and fourth respectively
- Categories seeing institutes of national importance domination: engineering (49), management (31) and research (22) \*
- Categories seeing State Public universities' domination: University (39) and Agriculture (29) \*

**State-wise representation in 2023 rankings:** Tamil Nadu, Delhi, Karnataka, Maharashtra, and Uttar Pradesh take the lion's share of the rankings in 2023





The graph does not include the states Arunachal Pradesh, and Nagaland and five union territories (Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Dadra and Nagar Haveli, Daman and Diu, Ladakh and Lakshadweep) that do not have representation in NIRF ranking.

**Key Observations**

- 52%** of the top ranked NIRF institutes are in four states and one union territory of India viz. Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Delhi, and Uttar Pradesh
- 5** Maharashtra, Karnataka, Delhi, Tamil Nadu, and Gujarat have representation across all the categories
- 12** states and UTs have less than 10 institutes combined across 11 categories
- 5** states and UTs have seen an improvement in their representation among the ranked institutions viz. Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Gujarat, and Odisha



**Dominance by size of institution:** Among the top universities, universities with student strength more than 5,000 dominate, particularly in the private space



- 32** of the top 100 universities have 10,000+ student strength. This proportion increases to **70 per cent** when the **top 20** universities are considered
- 47** private universities in top 100 have 10,000+ student strength. Among top 50, this share increases to **60 per cent**
- 13** public universities in top 100 have >10,000 student strength

**Parameter-wise performance in public vis-à-vis private universities:** Among the top universities, public institutions outperform the private institutions in Research and Graduation Outcomes in NIRF 2023




### Comparison with the previous year:


- **The average scores of private universities have improved across all parameters** indicating increasing competition among the top private universities. RPC parameter has seen the biggest improvement (24.71 in 2022 to 29.88 in 2023) indicating a strong focus among private universities to improve research outcomes
- Public universities, while still ahead of private universities this year, have seen a drop in average scores across GO and PERC parameters compared to NIRF 2022 results.

Differences noted in RPC and perception parameters as well:

- **Public universities perform marginally better in RPC:** 29 per cent of private universities scored lower than 20 in RPC compared to 26 per cent of public universities
- **Private universities perform marginally better in perception:** 73 per cent of private universities scored greater than 30 in perception compared to 55 per cent of public universities.

# **NIRF 2023 – Category-specific ranking analysis**

## Overview of NIRF – 2023 rankings

The National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) is an initiative of the Ministry of Education (MoE) to rank higher education institutions across India. In addition to other quality assessment efforts by the Government of India, such as National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC- for colleges and universities) and the National Board of Accreditation (NBA) for technical and professional institutions, the NIRF is a framework, introduced in 2016, to objectively compare institutions on parameters such as teaching performance, research output, diversity, graduation outcome and reputation. The 8th edition of the NIRF rankings was released on 5 June 2023.


The NIRF aims to identify and recognise top performing institutions, promote competitiveness among institutions and assist prospective students in their decision-making process when selecting institutions.

### Categories of rankings:

NIRF releases overall rankings for universities and colleges as well as domain-specific rankings in different disciplines to provide a common view of comparable institutions. There are, in total, 13 categories of rankings under NIRF- 2023 with two new categories – Agriculture & Allied Sectors and Innovation -- introduced this year. The ranking methodology for these distinct categories is tailored to suit the nuances of individual discipline.

The number of participating institutes has been increasing since the launch of NIRF in 2016 across all categories, showing the growing popularity and preference to participate in NIRF rankings. In 2023, the total number of participating institutes<sup>1</sup> (5543) was ~15 per cent higher than participating institutes in 2022 (4780).


## Highlights of NIRF 2023 – University category

- The university category ranks participating state-public, state-private, central, and deemed-to-be universities across the nation across the five parameters. This year's top three ranked private institutions and public institutions are:


The top three public institutions continue to hold their fort at the top of the rankings. Manipal Academy of Higher Education, Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham and Vellore Institute of Technology continue to be the top ranked private universities, albeit unlike last year, Manipal Academy of Higher education has surpassed Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham to become the top private university at rank six.

- State public universities dominate the rankings:** The top 100 university rankings are dominated by state public universities (39) followed by private deemed to be universities (34).
  - Out of the total 51 central universities<sup>2</sup> in the country, 14 feature in the NIRF top 100
  - The overall split of public and private universities is 59:41 in NIRF top 100 universities.


**Variation in scores by rank band:** The difference in scores for the ranks one and two is 14.24 points, whereas the average difference is only 0.85 points in the between rest of the universities from rank one to 10 highlighting the clear lead enjoyed by university ranked first over the others. For universities in the rank band 11–100, a small shift in score would result in a large shift of their ranking due to small deviations in scores in these rank bands



**The number of ranked institutions in Tamil Nadu (22) is more than double in any other state (21 universities in 2022).** Maharashtra and Karnataka emerge as states with 10 universities, each.

Interestingly both private and public universities (including both state and centrally funded public) universities in Tamil Nadu have made equal contribution (11 each) in the state emerging as an outlier on overall university rankings. This highlights the state’s overall dominance in terms of quality of education offered across all types of universities. A similar trend is seen in Maharashtra and Karnataka as well; however up north in Delhi and UP, almost all universities that made it to the top 100 are public universities.

**State-wise distribution of top 100 ranked universities**





**There are nine new entrants into top 100:** Four of the nine new entrants have participated for the first time whereas the others have made significant jumps from beyond the rank 100 in 2022 into top 100 in 2023.


**A total of 42 universities have shown an improvement in rankings:** The top four climbers within the top 100 have been depicted below. Birla Institute of Technology made the highest jump of 28 positions from 2022 driven by the significant improvement in GO and Perception parameters. The second highest improvement was Shoolini University of Biotechnology and Management Sciences which made a jump by 23 positions.





**40 universities have dropped in rankings this year.** The universities which have dropped maximum number of ranks from 2022 are shown below along with their change in parameter scores. It is important to note that majority of these universities have retained almost the same score as the previous year yet

experienced a significant drop in ranking. One of the key reasons for their decline is the corresponding rank band in which these universities fall, where a minimal score change can result in larger drop in ranks. Also, there are an increased number of universities scoring marginally higher and thereby getting better ranks. So, these universities, despite maintaining similar scores have suffered a drop in rankings. This points to an increasing competition between the universities, wherein a stagnation or marginal decline in score can result in a significant shift in ranks.




## Highlights of NIRF 2023 – Engineering category


- **Total number of participating institutions:** The engineering category has seen an increase in number of participating institutes (about five per cent) from 1249 in 2022 to 1314 in 2023. The engineering category has the second highest number of institutes participating in the ranking after colleges category making it one of the most competitive categories. Out of the participating institutions, a total of 100 institutes have been given unique ranks and the next 100 institutions have been categorised in two rank bands (100–150 and 151–200). This is a change from 2022 where unique ranks were assigned to top 200 institutions.
- The top ranked institutions in NIRF 2023 in the engineering category are as follows:

- **Institutes of National Importance and Private Deemed Universities dominate the top 100 institutes**, where almost half of the share is taken by Institutes of National Importance alone. Affiliated colleges saw a maximum number of drops in top 100 rankings vis-à-vis last year.




**Variation in scores by rank band:** For the engineering category, the variation of scores, that is the difference in maximum score and minimum score in that rank band, decreases as the ranks drop. This implies that a unit shift in score in the lower rank bands will result in a significant shift in the rankings.



**Fifteen among the top ranked engineering institutes are from Tamil Nadu:** In continuation to their performance in 2022 rankings, 15 institutions are from Tamil Nadu, followed by Delhi, Karnataka, and Uttar Pradesh with seven institutions each. Similar to the trend observed in overall university rankings, southern states see both private and public institutes making it to top ranks, however in northern states like Delhi and Uttar Pradesh, most ranked institutes are public / public affiliated institutions.





**Among the top 100 institutions in 2023, a total of 36 institutions have shown an improvement in ranking:** National Institute of Technology Delhi made highest jump of 143 ranks followed by Rajiv Gandhi Institute of Petroleum Technology which made a jump of 103 ranks. These improvement in rankings are majorly driven by the improvement in TLR and RPC scores.

**Among the top 100 institutions in 2023, 46 institutions have shown a drop in their ranking:** AU College of Engineering (A) dropped most by 17 ranks followed by National Institute of Technology, Srinagar which saw a drop by 16 ranks. Out of the four institutions who have seen the highest drop in ranks among top 100 institutions in 2023, two of them saw a drop in their rank despite improving their overall score when compared to 2022 scores.




- **Total of 776 institutes participated in the NIRF 2023 management category:** The number of participating institutes increased to 776 in 2023 from 751 institutes in 2022 and the number of institutions ranked in this category is 100 which is the same as the previous year.
- **Top three public and private management institutes:** Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode featured in the top three ranks, displacing Indian Institute of Management Calcutta, for the first time from the top three ranks. The highest ranked public and private institutions within the management category in NIRF 2023 are shown below:

Amongst the top 100 ranked institutes, there are 31 institutes of national importance followed by 27 private autonomous institutes, 14 state private universities and 12 deemed private universities.




**Variation of scores by rank band:** For management ranking category, the variation of scores, which is the difference in maximum score and minimum score in that rank band decreases as the ranks drop. The spread of scores by rank band is shown by the graph below.



**Uttar Pradesh has the highest number of ranked institutions among all states closely followed by Tamil Nadu and Maharashtra:**

Uttar Pradesh has 11 institutes featuring in top 100 ranking followed by Tamil Nadu and Maharashtra with 10 and nine institutes, respectively. #### State-wise distribution of top 100 management institutions







**A total of 44 Institutions have shown an improvement in rankings this year:** The institutions which shown the maximum rise in ranks (from 2022) are shown below along with their growth in parameter scores. K. J. Somaiya Institute of Management Studies and Research, Indian Institute of Management Bodh Gaya, Chitkara University, and Christ University have climbed 26, 20, 16, and 12 ranks respectively attaining 45<sup>th</sup>, 53<sup>rd</sup>, 64<sup>th</sup>, and 60<sup>th</sup> ranks, respectively. All these four institutes have shown an improvement in TLR (Teaching, Learning, and Resources), and RPC (Research, Professional Practice & Collaborative Performance) score in comparison to the previous year.

**A total of 38 institutions have dropped in rankings this year:** The institutions which have dropped maximum number of ranks (from 2022) are shown below along with their decline in parameter scores. Indian Institute of Management Sirmaur, PSG College of Technology, Visvesvaraya Technological University, BML Munjal University, and Nirma University saw the highest decline from 69<sup>th</sup>, 63<sup>rd</sup>, 76<sup>th</sup> and 54<sup>th</sup> ranks in 2022 to 98<sup>th</sup>, 89<sup>th</sup>, 95<sup>th</sup> and 72<sup>nd</sup> ranks in 2023, respectively.


## Highlights of NIRF 2023 - College category

- A total of 2,746 colleges participated in this category this year<sup>3</sup>:** This is a 21 per cent increase from last year when 2,270 colleges participated in the ranking. Maximum participation has been from Maharashtra (473 colleges), followed by Tamil Nadu (383 colleges), and Andhra Pradesh (210 colleges). Since the introduction of college category, the number of participating institutions has grown five times from 535 in 2017 to **2746** in 2023, out of which top 200 institutions have been ranked/categorised with top 100 institutions being assigned unique ranks.
- University colleges and private aided colleges dominate the ranking:** Miranda House has been ranked first for four consecutive years in a row. PSGR Krishnammal College for Women, ranked fourth, is the highest ranked private aided college.

- Ten out of the top 20 colleges are in Delhi:** Tamil Nadu dominates the top 100 ranks with 35 institutions this year followed by Delhi with 32 institutions, followed by Kerala with 14 institutions. Out of the 57 participating colleges from Delhi, 32 have been ranked in the top 100 (nearly 56 per cent). Out of the 383 colleges of Tamil Nadu, 35 have been ranked in the top 100 (almost 9 per cent). Overall, the representation of states has remained almost constant over the last five years.


### State-wise distribution of top 100 colleges










- Increase in participation in NIRF 2023:** Since the introduction of the medical category in 2018, more than 100 medical institutions participated in NIRF rankings. A total of 176 institutes applied in 2023, out of which the top 50 institutes have been ranked. The participating institutes constitute ~28 per cent of total medical institutes (about 612) in the country.
- Top ranked medical institutes across categories:** All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi has been ranked first for the fifth consecutive year in medical category. Christian Medical College, Vellore, at third rank, continues to be the top ranked private medical institution in the country.

- Public institutions claim majority in top 50:** Amongst the top 50 institutes, there are 29 public institutes (including institute of national importance, institute under state legislature act, central university, state public university, public affiliated institutions, deemed university - government /government aided and constituent / university college). There are 11 private deemed universities amongst the top 50 as well.




- Variation in scores:** For ranks 1-5, the variation between minimum and maximum scores is around 22.22 marks. For institutions in the lower rank band 31–50, the difference in scores is much less and a small deviation in scores would result in a significant increase or decrease these rank bands.

### State-wise distribution of top 50 medical institutions








- Private institutions dominate the dental rankings:** In contrast to other categories, majority of the institutions ranked in dental category are private institutions (nearly 65 per cent), however, this is lower than the previous year (almost 72 per cent). These institutes are predominantly affiliated colleges followed by deemed universities and constituent university colleges. Only fourteen out of the top 40 ranked institutions are public/government funded institutions, which is three more than the previous year. The distribution is as below:



- Variation in scores:** For the top ten ranks, the variation between minimum and maximum scores is around 22.94 marks. 
- Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, and Maharashtra host the maximum number of top ranked dental institutes in the country.** The three states, in total, account for 60 per cent of the top 40 dental institutions and have been dominating rankings through the last four years.

Interestingly, most ranked institutes in Tamil Nadu and a majority in Karnataka and Maharashtra are private institutes or constituent colleges of private universities, whereas in states like UP and Delhi, all ranked institutions are public institutions or colleges affiliated to public institutions. This trend is in line with overall university rankings where ranked universities in northern states of India are more likely to be public universities whereas in other regions, private universities take equal or more spots amongst top ranked institutes.

- **A total of nine new entrants into top 40:** Seven institutions who did not make the cut in NIRF 2022 have now achieved a rank in top 40 this year. Two institutions which did not participate last year have managed to break into top 40 ranks in their first year of participation. Details of new entrants are provided in table below:



- **A total of sixteen institutions have shown an improvement in rankings:** The institutions which made the highest climb (from NIRF 2022) are shown below along with their growth in parameter scores. Sri Ramachandra Institute of Higher Education and Research (from 13 to seven) has seen a jump of six ranks, Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham (from 19 to 12), Aligarh Muslim University (from 38 to 31), Government Dental College, Indore (from 39 to 32) have seen a significant jump of seven ranks. 


## Highlights of NIRF 2023 – Pharmacy category


- Increase in participation in NIRF:** Pharmacy was one of the first categories introduced by NIRF. Number of participating institutions increased to 435 from 400 in NIRF 2022 ranking. Out of these 435, 84 were new participants. Interestingly, 49 institutions that participated last year in the rankings, did not participate this year.
- Increase in per cent of institutes ranked:** The participating institutions constitute nearly 50 per cent of total pharmacy institutions in the country (857 pharmacy institutions that are AICTE approved in 2022-23).
- Top ranked pharmacy institutes across categories:** National Institute of Pharmaceutical Education and Research, Hyderabad has topped the category. Birla Institute of Technology & Science, Pilani, at rank three is the top private institution in the category. The top three private institutions from NIRF rankings 2022 continue to retain their spots NIRF 2023. Institute of Chemical Technology, Mumbai jumped from rank seven (2022) to rank five (2023).





- **Institutions showing an improvement in rankings:** Overall, 33 institutions have seen a climb in their rankings, whereas six institutions have maintained their ranks, as compared to 2022. Parul University and National Institute of Pharmaceutical Education and Research Hajipur have seen a significant jump of 33 and 31 ranks to rank 53<sup>rd</sup> and 44<sup>th</sup> respectively in NIRF 2023 ranks for Pharmacy category. 






- State public universities dominate the rankings: The rankings continue to be dominated by state public universities (12 in top 30) similar to the trend seen in previous editions of NIRF rankings, although the total (12) is down from 14 last year (NIRF 2022).

### State-wise distribution of top 30 law institutions





- **Top eight universities are concentrated in Northern India** – Ranked law institutes in Delhi and Uttar Pradesh (four each) are all centrally funded or state public universities. However, in Odisha, Karnataka and Tamil Nadu, more private universities have made it to the top ranks.
- **There are four new entrants in top 30** which include three Private Universities and one Central University.
- **There is a significant change in the institute rankings** with eight out of 11 private universities moving up in ranks including three new entrants. While five public universities have improved their rankings and two hold their existing rankings, ranks of six public universities have slipped down compared to NIRF 2022.



- Institutions with an improvement in rankings:** Overall, eleven institutions have seen a climb in their rankings whereas three institutions have maintained their ranks, as compared to 2022. Indian Law Institute has seen a significant movement of 12 ranks. Shanmugha Arts Science Technology & Research Academy, Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University and Amity University, Haryana, Gurgaon have moved up by four ranks. There are two government institutions and two private institutions amongst the four big movers.

- Institutions with a decline in rankings:** Overall, 12 institutions have seen a drop in their rankings compared to 18 in NIRF 2022. National Law University, Cuttack has seen a drop of five ranks. National Law University and Judicial Academy, Kamrup; and Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University, Lucknow have seen a drop of four ranks, respectively.

## Highlights of NIRF 2023 – Architecture category

- **Total number of participating institutions:**

Since the introduction of architecture as a category in 2018, the number of participating institutions has seen a steady rise. The category started with 59 institutions participating in 2018, which has grown to 105 institutions in 2023.

- 105 institutions have applied in 2023 out of which top 30 institutions have been ranked. In 2022 as well, the top 30 institutions were ranked out of the 91 applications.

- **IIT Roorkee, NIT Calicut and IIT Kharagpur continue their dominance at the top**



**occupying the first three positions in that order.** Seven out of the top 10 from 2022 rankings retained their positions in 2023 rankings.

- Every institute in the top 10 was a public institute in the 2022 rankings and in **2023 the category saw the first private entrant in top 10**, Centre for Environmental Planning and Technology University, Ahmedabad with seventh rank.


- **Institutes of National Importance are in majority in top 30:** Nearly 40 per cent of the ranked institutes (12 out of 30) are Institutes of National Importance. The same 12 institutes were present in the top 30 of the NIRF 2022 rankings as well.



- Variation in scores:** For the top five ranks, the variation between minimum and maximum scores is around 18.07 marks. For institutions in the lower rank band 6–30, a small shift in score would result in a significant increase or decrease of their ranking due to small deviations in scores in these rank bands

- The top 30 institutions in the category are distributed across 19 states with three institutions from Tamil Nadu, Punjab, and Karnataka each.** Delhi, Kerala, West Bengal, Madhya Pradesh, and Gujarat are next with each state having two institutions in the top 30 of NIRF 2023 rankings.

- **There are four new entrants in the list:** While the top three ranking institutions remained the same as those from 2022 ranking, the rest of the rankings witnessed a shuffle. There are four new entrants. Two new entrants made it in top 10 ranks at seventh and eighth place which are Centre for Environmental Planning and Technology University, Ahmedabad, and the National Institute of Technology Rourkela, respectively.



## Highlights of NIRF 2023 – Research category


- **Total Number of participating institutions:** This category was introduced in 2021 in the NIRF rankings and in the third edition of research category rankings, a total of 50 institutions have been ranked.
- The methodology used for evaluation of institutes under research categories are different from other categories. The parameters used to evaluate are Quantitative Research, Qualitative Research, Student & Faculty Contribution, Outreach & Inclusivity and Perception.
- The top ranked public and private institutions in the research category are as follows:

- Research specific institutions like Tata Institute of Fundamental Research (10), Academy of Scientific & Innovative Research (12) and Homi Bhabha National Institute (15) have participated and have been ranked among the top 50 institutions under research category.
- Public institutions claim majority in top 50 rankings: 39 of the top 50 institutions are public institutions in the top 50 ranking. 'Institutions of National importance' category contributes to around 50 per cent (~22 institutions) of the top 50 institutions in research category. The distribution is as below:




- **Variation in scores:** For the 1-5 and 6-10 rank bands, the variation between minimum and maximum scores is huge, around 14.59 and 8.67 marks. For institutions in the lower rank band 11–50, a small shift in score would result in a significant increase or decrease of their ranking due to small deviations in scores in these rank bands.



- Tamil Nadu has strong dominance in the research category with nine institutions** featuring in the top 50. This is followed by Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, and Maharashtra with each having around five institutions in the top 50 in NIRF 2023 rankings.

**State-wise distribution of Ranked Research Institutions**







- Institutions with increase in ranking:** Overall 13 institutions have seen an increase in their rankings compared to 2022. Saveetha Institute of Medical and Technical Sciences has moved up by 12 ranks followed by Anna University that has moved up eight ranks. The institutions that have seen the highest upward movement in ranks compared to NIRF 2022 are shown below along with their change in parameter scores.

- Institutions with decline in ranking:** Overall 23 institutions have seen a decline in their rankings compared to 2022. Bharathiar University has seen a drop of 16 ranks followed by Institute of Chemical Technology with a drop of 12 ranks from NIRF 2022 rankings. The institutions that have seen the maximum decline in ranks from 2022 are shown below along with their change in parameter scores.




## Highlights of NIRF 2023 – Agriculture and Allied Sectors category

- In the NIRF 2023 rankings, a new category called 'Agriculture and Allied Sectors' has been introduced, **attracting participation from 152 institutes**. However, only the **top 40 ranks** have been awarded in this category.
- The evaluation methodology used for institutes in the Agriculture and Allied Sector category is similar to that of other categories (with the exception of Research Institutions). The evaluation parameters are **TLR, RP, GO, OI and PR**.
- **Top-ranked Institutions:** The NIRF 2023 rankings for the Agriculture and Allied Sector category revealed that public institutions have dominated the list. Out of the top 40 ranked institutions. The top five institutes in this category are highlighted below. Lovely Professional University, ranked at number 27, is the only private university featuring in the list.



All the institutes capturing a spot in the top 40 are either state public universities, central universities or deemed universities under government control, only one is a state private university




- A significant presence of public institutions in the top ranks signifies **the government's commitment to promoting excellence in agricultural research and education**. Additionally, the presence of a sole state private university in the top 40 **highlights the potential for private institutions to compete in this sector**.

- Tamil Nadu dominates the list with five institutions, followed by Haryana, Karnataka, and Uttar Pradesh with four institutions each. However, it is noteworthy that the **top 40 agricultural institutions are distributed across the country**, highlighting the availability of good-quality agricultural education in most states. This accessibility is particularly impactful in a context where majority of the population is dependent on agriculture as primary source of income.
- Variation in scores by rank band:** Within one to 10 ranks, the variation between minimum and maximum scores is around 24 points, while the score variation decreases in ranks beyond 20. For institutions in the lower rank band 11–40, a small shift in score would result in a significant increase or decrease of their ranking due to small deviations in scores in these rank bands.



## Way forward

The eight consecutive editions of NIRF have seen an increasing number of institutions participating in the rankings. This has resulted in an increased competition between the education institutes, at the same time, has brought about a focus on quality enhancement in the higher education system. Comprising of five curated parameters, the framework has also given a renewed thrust on improving the research outcome of the institutions.

KPMG in India has been interpreting the NIRF results since its inception. We have also been having extensive discussions with many of our clients in the higher education space. Based on our discussions and understanding, we have a few suggestions for further strengthening NIRF. We believe these suggestions could help in bringing more objectivity, promoting competitiveness, and assisting prospective students in their decision-making process when selecting institutions.

1. **Gradual evolution towards a holistic framework:** The framework may gradually evolve to incorporate and assess the institutions on forward-looking outcome-based practices. For instance, demonstration of robust and transparent governance practices, effectiveness of technology integration, interdisciplinary character in research, focus on sustainability, industry exposure to students, etc.
2. **Introduction of sub-category rankings:** The framework may further diversify into sub-category rankings to provide a level playing to distinct types of institutions. Certain categories such as engineering and management see intense competition with over 7-8 varied types of participating institutions. Sub-categorization may be done based on type of ownership (public or private), age of the institution etc.
3. **Expanding the number of subjects:** The framework may be expanded to a wider set of subjects (similar to the leading global ranking frameworks) to improve the relevance of the framework to the students to make informed decisions and the academic community at large.
4. **Stronger monitoring and verification mechanism:** A stronger data collection, validation and verification mechanism shall instill greater confidence among the academic fraternity.
5. **Transition to an integrated ranking and accreditation system:** In line with the NEP, the framework may make a gradual transition towards a single and comprehensive ranking and accreditation system requiring a one-time collection of data and using that for all ranking and accreditation purposes.
