Welcome to the Q1 2026 edition of Turkish Startup Investments Review with the collaboration of KPMG Turkey M&A and the 212 teams.

This is the 22nd edition of our quarterly review, aimed at highlighting key trends, opportunities, and challenges in the venture capital market, both globally and in Turkey.

Global venture capital investment surged to \$330.9 billion across 8,464 deals in Q1 2026, representing an increase of over 160% in deal value and more than 10% in deal count compared with the same period last year (Q1 2025: \$126.3 billion across 7,551 deals). There were 4 megadeals exceeding \$10 billion value in Q1 2026 and 3 of them were in AI vertical whereas the other one was in transportation, namely Waymo's late stage investment amounting \$16 billion. The top ten investments accounted for \$206.3 billion of total global VC funding in Q1 2026, highlighting the unprecedented concentration of capital in large-scale AI financings. The quarter was led by a record-breaking \$122 billion investment in OpenAI, followed by Anthropic's \$30.6 billion raise and a \$20 billion round for xAI. Other notable AI investments included \$2.3 billion in Shield AI and \$2.0 billion in Rokid, further underscoring the scale and intensity of capital deployment into the AI sector.

The Turkish startup ecosystem recorded a total of 42 deals amounting to \$559.2 million, including acquisitions, in Q1 2026. This represents a significant increase compared to the same quarter of the previous year (\$70.2 million).

Overall, Q1 2026 highlighted the central role of the gaming sector within Turkey's startup ecosystem, supported by sustained investor interest. Loom Games' majority stake acquisition with a deal value of approximately \$500 million by US-based Scopely in February 2026 stood out as the largest transaction of the quarter, further reflecting the Turkish gaming ecosystem's ability to attract large-scale international transactions.

Looking ahead to Q2 2026 and beyond, several strategic verticals are expected to see significant investor activity. AI-focused solutions, particularly in advanced robotics and enabling infrastructure, continue to drive a strong wave of capital deployment. As a direct consequence of AI's rapid expansion and energy-intensive nature, we also anticipate a surge in investment across alternative energy and cleantech, as the need for scalable, efficient energy sources becomes increasingly urgent. Simultaneously, ongoing global geopolitical tensions have pushed defense-tech and cybersecurity to the forefront of investor interest. Across all these verticals, we expect elevated deal volume and robust startup formation, positioning them as key areas for venture capital in the coming quarters.

Main highlights in Turkey's startup ecosystem in Q1 2026

Globally, VC investment surged to \$330.9 billion across 8,464 deals in Q1 2026, up from \$138.1 billion and 7,981 deals in the previous quarter (Q4 2025), driven primarily by the seamless acceleration in AI-focused investments. The US led the surge, driven by several landmark AI-focused funding rounds, including a \$122 billion investment in OpenAI, alongside a \$30 billion raise by Anthropic and a \$20 billion round for xAI, all centered on large language model development. Asia and Europe also got the year off to a solid start, with several \$1B+ deals across AI, robotics, energy, and infrastructure. While dealmaking slowed slightly toward the end of the quarter due to rising uncertainty, Q1 still marked one of the strongest starts to a year in recent memory.

The Turkish startup ecosystem reached a deal volume of \$559.2 million in Q1 2026, up from \$70.2 million in Q1 2025, in line with the global market trend.

Acquisitions accounted for the largest share of total deal volume at 91% (\$509.2M), while seed stage investments represented 3%. In terms of deal count, seed-stage rounds led with 35 transactions, followed by startup acquisitions with 6 deals. In contrast, Q1 2025 was driven primarily by early-stage investments, which represented 61% of total deal volume, whereas in Q1 2026 their contribution declined significantly to 5%, with only one early-stage deal recorded. Notably in Q1 2026, 5 of the top 10 largest deals were seed stage investments, and the top 10 deals collectively made up 99% of the total deal volume.

Local investors led in terms of deal count, while foreign investors dominated in deal volume. Local investors were involved in 40 transactions, representing a deal volume of \$55 million, which accounts for 10% of the total deal volume. In contrast, foreign investors participated in only 2 deals but contributed a significantly larger share, with a deal volume of \$504 million, representing 90% of the total deal volume.

The healthtech sector recorded the highest number of deals with 5 transactions, followed by artificial intelligence, gaming and robotics with 4 deals respectively. In terms of total deal volume, gaming led the way with 534.5 million raised across 4 deals, followed by fintech with \$7 million and SaaS with \$6.6 million.

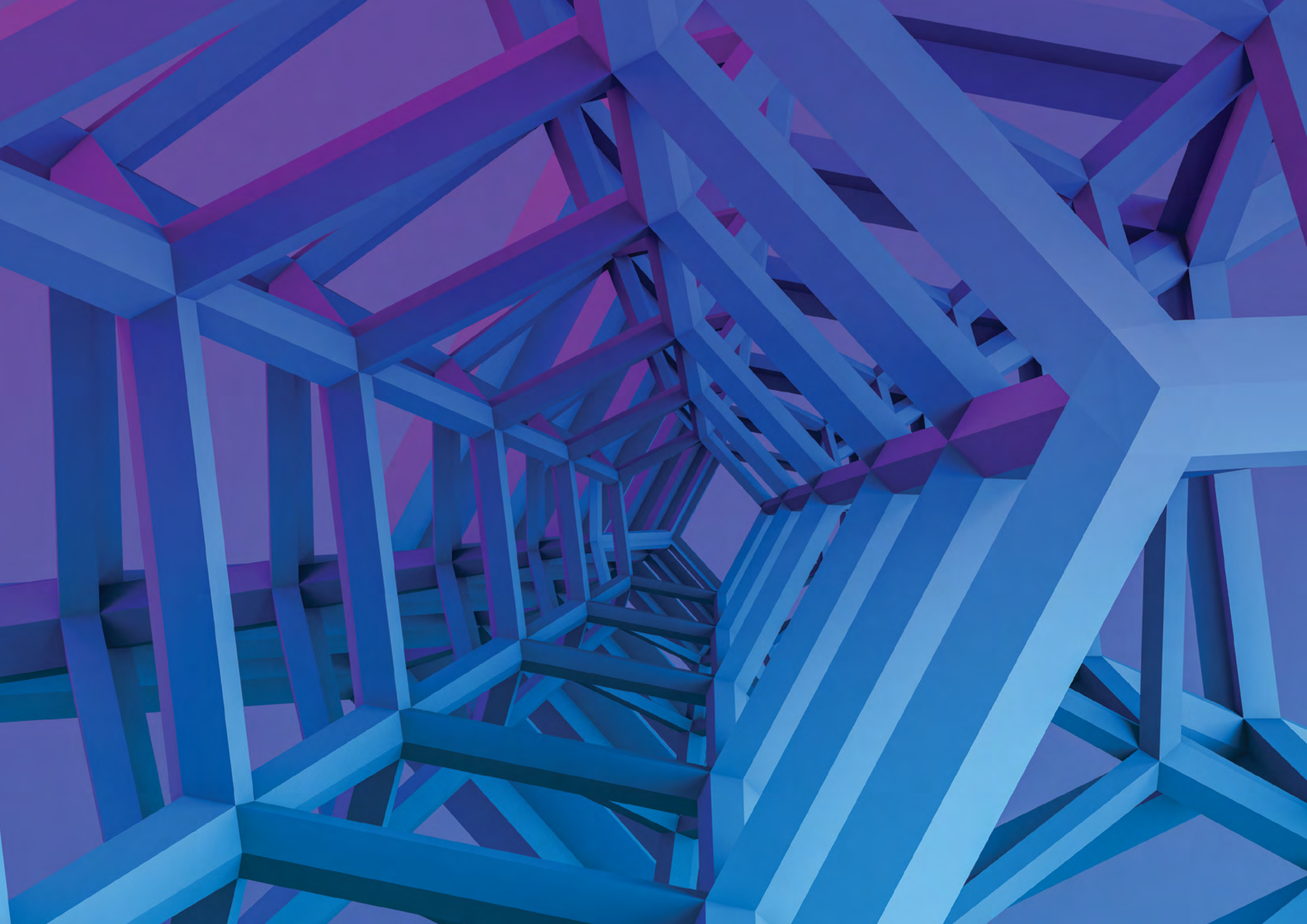
In February 2026, Loom Games, a Turkey-based game developer focused on building accessible, player-driven games, was acquired by U.S.-based Scopely for \$500.1 million, resulting in Scopely acquiring a 50% stake. Following the transaction, Loom Games' valuation was stated to be above \$1 billion, marking its official entry into unicorn status.

In January 2026, Turkish mobile gaming company TaleMonster Games received a \$30 million early-stage investment from Arcadia Gaming Partners, Andreessen Horowitz, General Catalyst and Point72 Ventures. This early-stage funding represents a strategic growth that likely accelerated the company's expansion by pairing its product vision with the acquirer's scale, resources, and market reach.

Dataroid, a digital analytics and customer engagement platform, secured a \$6.6 million investment in January 2026 from FinAI GSYF, Gelecek Etki GSYF, Endeavor Catalyst. This investment positions Dataroid for its next growth phase by accelerating international expansion, strengthening its AI-driven analytics capabilities, and reinforcing its ambition to become a global standard digital analytics platform.

In January 2026, the Turkish fintech company Ödüyo, who develops solutions in online collections and open banking, was acquired by QNB eSolutions for \$5 million. The founder stated that the company has quickly established a strong position in fintech by combining an innovation driven culture and a user centric approach. Following its inclusion under QNB eSolutions, it aims to build more integrated e-document solutions and deliver faster, more transparent, and scalable collection experiences across a broader ecosystem.

In March 2026, Turkish mobile gaming studio Vento Games secured a \$4 million seed investment led by Makers Fund and Arcadia Gaming Partners. The funding supports Vento Games' ambition to expand its portfolio of mobile puzzle games. Founded by executives with experience at major gaming companies including Peak Games, Fugo and Zynga, the company aims to combine a data-driven development mindset with globally appealing casual gameplay to strengthen its position in the international mobile gaming market.

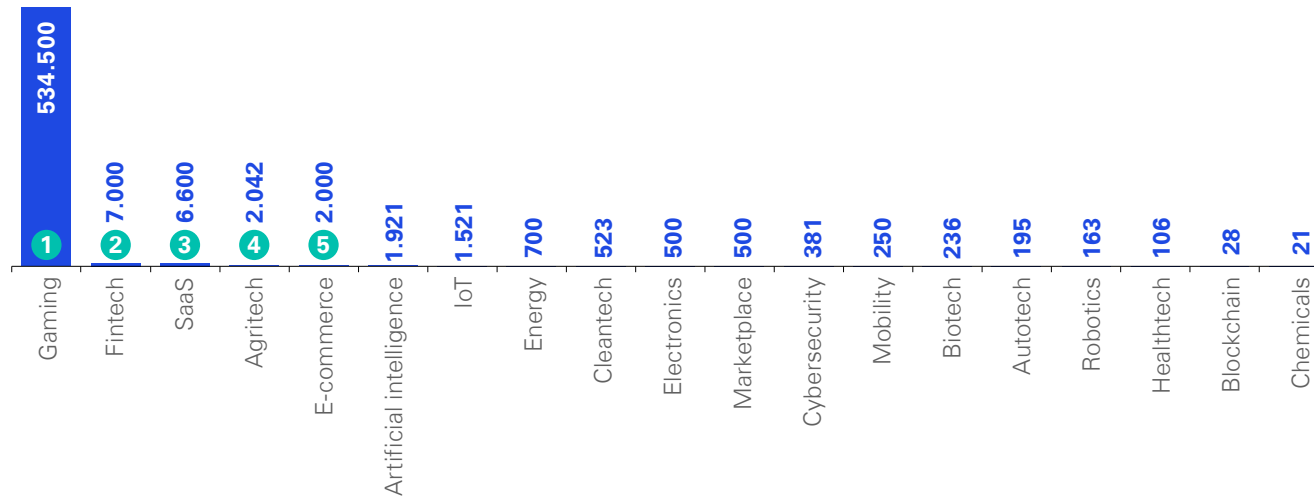

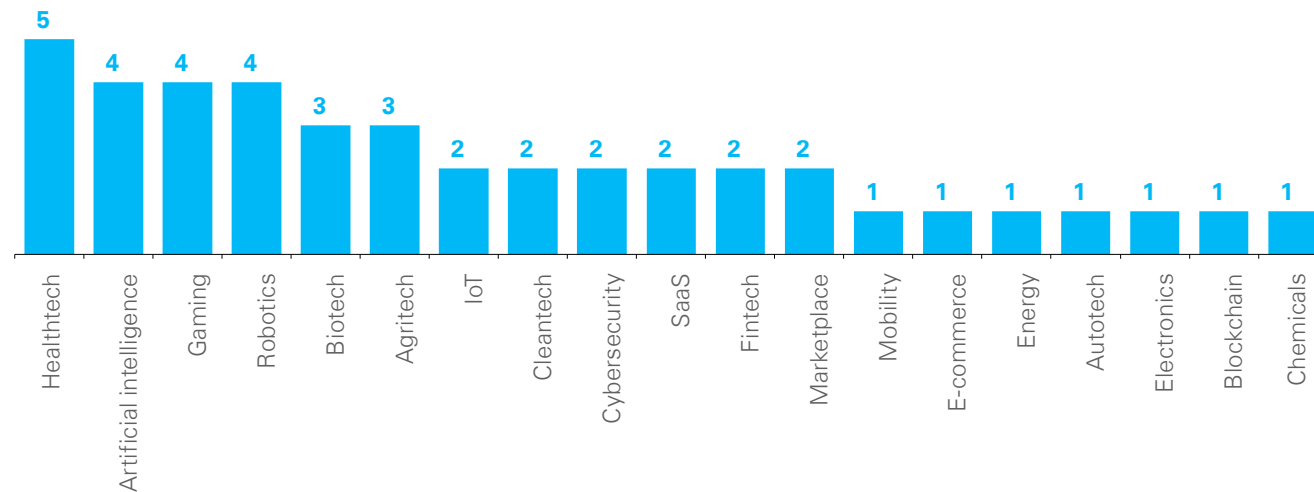

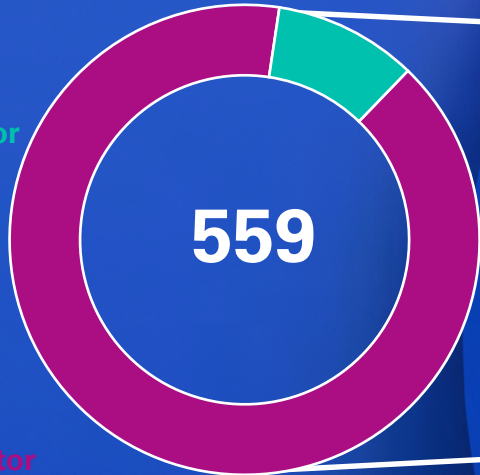
Leading Verticals and Prominent Deals

- In Q1 2026, healthtech was the leading vertical in terms of deal count with 5 transactions. It was followed by artificial intelligence, gaming and robotics with 4 deals each, while biotech and agritech each recorded 3 transactions.
- 5 healthtech startups received seed stage investment from Tubitak Bigg Fund, \$21 thousand each.
- Vimesoft, an AI-powered software development and digital solutions company secured an investment of \$1.5 million from Mada Girişim Sermayesi, Re-Pie Portföy, Ziraat Portföy, Rebellius Capital and individual investors.
- Talemonster Games, a gaming startup, secured a \$30 million investment from Arcadia Gaming Partners, Andreessen Horowitz, General Catalyst and Point72 Ventures.

Breakdown of startup deals by origin of the investors

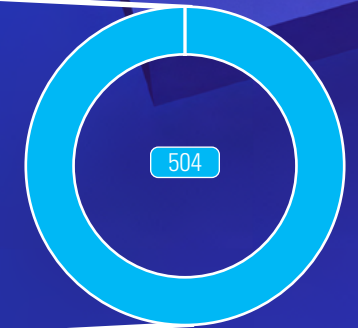

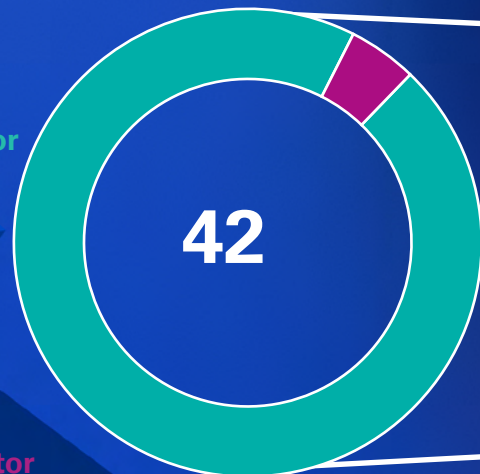

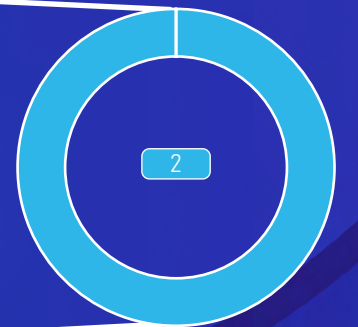

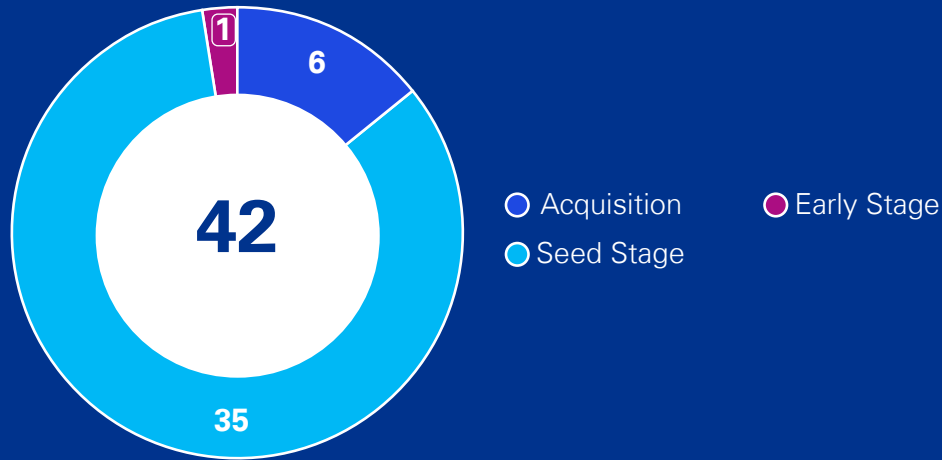

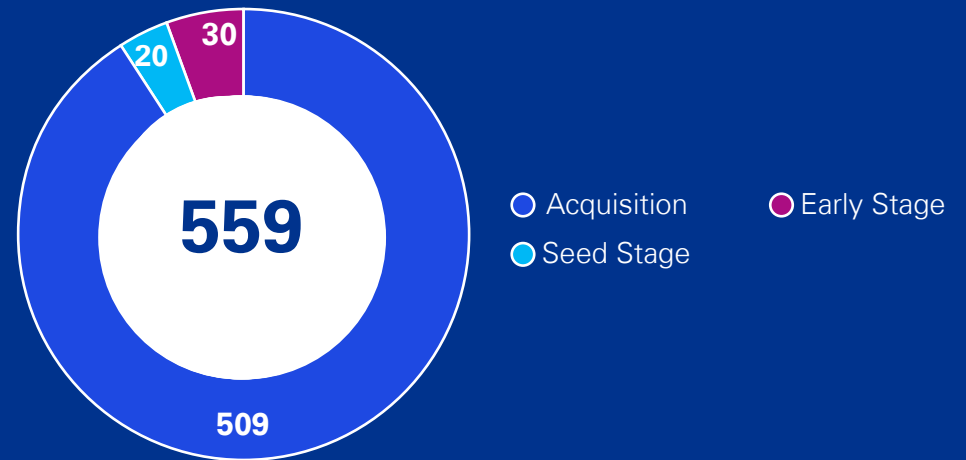


Startup deals according to their investment stage

Number of deals by Investment Stage

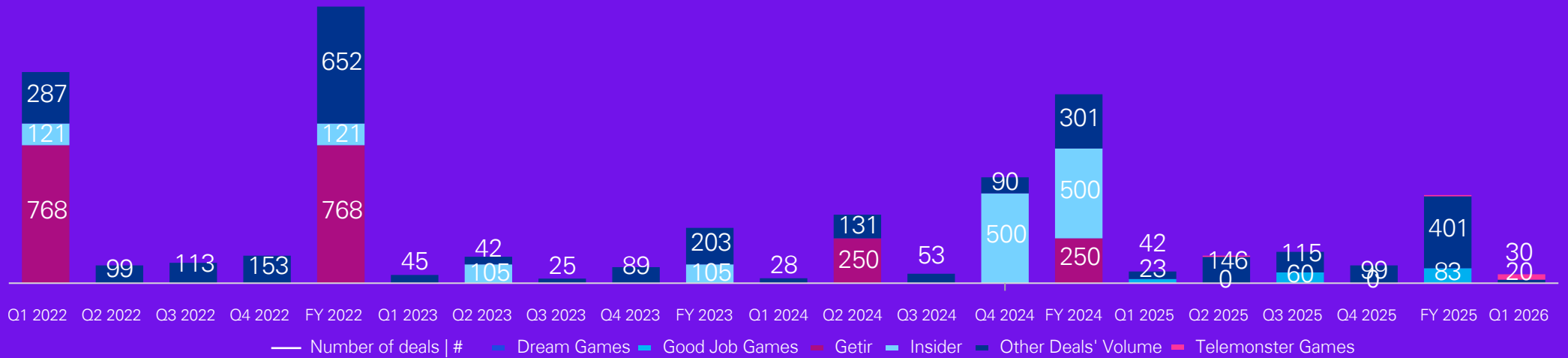


Deal volume by Investment Stage (USD million)



- Seed-stage investments recorded the highest number of deals with 35 transactions, while acquisitions led in deal volume with a total of \$509.2 million.
- There were a total of 6 startup acquisitions and the largest announced acquisition was Loom Games with \$500.1 million in deal volume.
- Early-stage activity was limited to a single transaction; however, this deal represented the second-largest transaction of Q1 2026, with a value of \$30 million, accounting for 5% of total deal volume.
- In Q1 2026, there wasn't any late stage investment recorded.

Breakdown of startup deals by quarters



- The total investment volume of \$559.2 million in the first quarter of 2026 showed a sharp increase, up from \$210 million in the last quarter of 2025, also it surpassed the figure for Q1 2025, which was \$70.2 million, nearly 8 times higher.
- The investment volume excluding acquisitions was \$50 million in Q1 2026, down from \$98.7 million in Q4 2025 and \$65 million in Q1 2025. The number of deals excluding acquisitions also declined to 36 in Q1 2026, compared with 96 in Q4 2025 and 52 in Q1 2025.
- For comparison purposes, only seed-stage, early-stage and late-stage deals are exhibited in the above graph, excluding startup acquisitions. In addition, crypto token-based transactions were included in the quarterly deal volume figures.

- Sierra Space, a US-based aviation and space technology company, has secured a \$550 million late-stage investment in March 2026 from Moore Strategic Ventures, General Atlantic, Coatue, LuminArx Capital Management, and Andalusian Private Capital. The funding will be used to expand production capacity, accelerate defense and space infrastructure development, and scale its spacecraft and satellite operations.
- US-based startup Reflow, established by founder Uğur Kaner in 2024, has raised \$15 million in seed-stage funding. The company brings workforce and workflow intelligence to enterprise operations, helping organizations understand what to automate and measure the ROI of AI-driven automation. With the investment from e2vc (Fund III), Better Tomorrow Ventures, Bling Capital, Designer Fund and Basis Set Ventures, the company aims to accelerate technology development and deliver workflow and AI automation intelligence to a broader base of enterprise customers.
- US-based SaaS startup Datatruck, founded by Shohruh Rahmanov, Mamur Kodirov, Aziz Ergashev and Ulugbek Ergashev, has secured \$12 million in early-stage funding, led by Avenue Growth Partners, DOMiNO Ventures, AloqaVentures and IT Park Ventures. According to the company, this investment will enhance the development of its AI-powered automation infrastructure, support product scaling, and boost operational efficiency and cash flow management for carriers.

- Nomadic, US-based artificial intelligence startup co-founded by Mustafa Bal, secured an \$8.4 million seed-stage investment by TQ Ventures and Pear VC. Their platform automatically analyzes raw video archives generated across a wide physical AI ecosystem, from industrial robots to autonomous vehicles, converting them into structured datasets ready for training.
- Axiology, a fintech company providing infrastructure for European capital markets which was founded in 2025, has secured a seed-stage investment of \$5.9 million from e2vc (Fund III), TIBAS Ventures, Plug and Play Fund, Coinvest Capital, BSV Ventures, Exponential Science and NGL. The company stated that the investment will be allocated to scaling its currently operational system and executing its market strategies.
- lem0n.ai, a US-based artificial intelligence startup founded by Yusuf Berkan Altun in 2023, was acquired in March 2026 by UK-based Bombora Digital for \$5 million. The company develops an AI-powered data intelligence platform that collects, processes, and analyzes large volumes of fragmented data to generate quick, relevant, and actionable insights for startups and investors. Following the acquisition, the platform and team will continue operating within Bombora Digital to support integration and further enhance its data-driven decision-making capabilities.

- Validfor, a US-based AI startup co-founded by Ömer Çimen and Uğur Metinol, has raised a \$1.2 million seed-stage investment from DOMiNO Ventures and Curiosity VC. With this investment the company announced that it will develop and globally scale its AI powered digital validation platform for the pharmaceutical, biotechnology, and medical sectors.
- Vidrush, an AI powered platform for long form video generation co-founded by Soner Abay and Ozan Yurtsever, has secured a \$1.2 million seed-stage funding from an undisclosed investor. The company is moving forward with a vision to make video production fully autonomous. It aims to make long-form video production scalable while keeping quality at the center.
- Aepnus Technology, co-founded by Bilen Aküzüm in 2021, secured a \$1 million seed-stage investment from 212 NexT. The company announced that it will use the new investment to expand its team, develop its global projects, strengthen sectoral partnerships, and enhance its commercial and technical infrastructure.

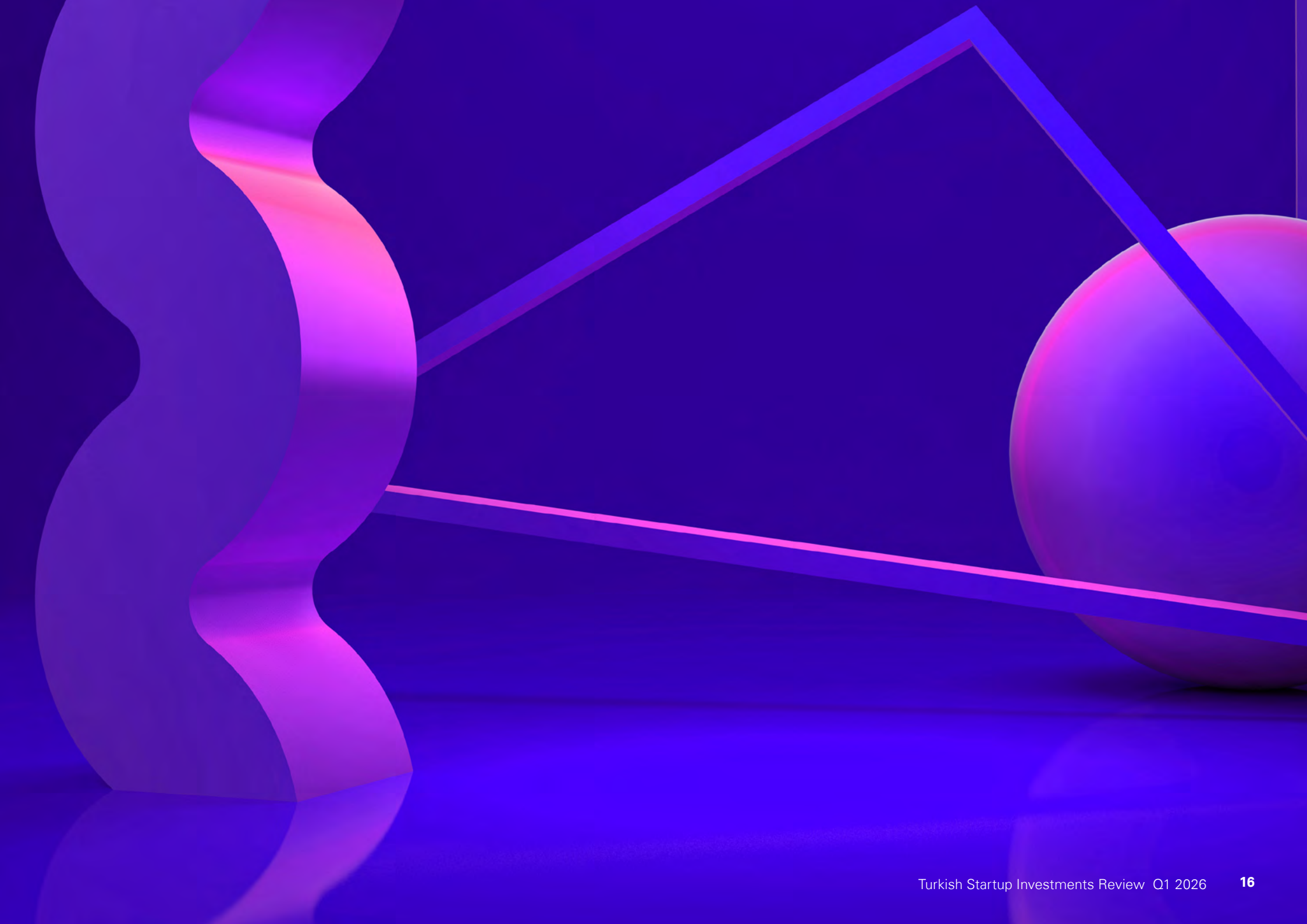
